Thursday June 29, 2023 at the Hawai'i Convention Center

This reception will celebrate 30 years of the Hawai'i Conservation Conference while focusing on the critical work yet to be done. This Conference brings together students, researchers, managers, and community leaders to advance mālama 'āina in Hawai'i. CONFERENCE GATHERING SPACE (1 Opportunity)

Networking is a critical function of the Hawai'i Conservation Conference, especially for students and emerging professionals. A gathering space will allow for informal and unplanned meetings and discussions among conference attendees. This room will have a mix of large (10 pax) and small (4 pax) round top tables as well as lauhala mats for gathering on the floor.

SESSION RECORDING (24 Opportunities)

From 2020-2022, the HCC pivoted to a virtual format in response to the pandemic. While we are very excited to be able to gather in-person once again, one of the benefits of the virtual Conference was our ability to preserve video recordings of the presentations.
